Petition Drive

Prior to today, 8,138 have been collected.

We are slightly ahead of the plan; the goal was to collect 8,000 by July 13.

We need 7,500 certified to qualify for the ballot.

So far 4,200 have been turned in. 1,00 have been processed, with 823 of those receiving certification. Ken anticipates a rejection rate of 33%.

New London's goal is to collect 1,500 signatures. To date, we have collected 709.
